Flourishing Individuals

NAPLAN

The reports went out in Week 1 for our Year 3 and 5 students. This year we can't compare results to other years due to the changes. We have exceeding, strong, developing and needs support as the categories. Parent session held last week.

Attendance

If your child is sick, they need to remain at home until they are well and have no symptoms.

Attendance Plans are legal documents and if your child is attending less than 80% in any 5 week period, they will be placed on an attendance plan. These results are also placed on the Attendance Board in the undercover area for students to see where their attendance is and to goal set to improve their attendance every 5 week period.

Student Leadership

Student leaders have been working incredibly hard to set up morning fitness, the reading in the undercover area and also assisting with the Student Representative meetings. We have been discussing role modelling for other students, always demonstrating the expected behaviours, Excellence, Safety, Respect and Responsibility. We need to strive to be out BEST at all times.

SAER & Health and Wellbeing updates

This is a focus at Pegs Creek Primary School and recently we have created a space for our students in the preventative space, which is Sarah Goyder's office in the administration. We have also recently created time for a person to assist Anissa Hinchcliffe in ensuring our students at education risk have supports and plans put in place so they can access the curriculum as much as possible. Through leadership opportunities, like Future Leaders Program and also applying for the 'Key Teacher Role Autism Spectrum Disorder' leadership opportunity through DOE WA, she has been identified as the staff member to assist in this area.

Life-Long Learners

Positive Behaviour Supports

Our PBS team have been working incredibly hard in the background to continually build on our whole school approaches to Positive Behaviour Supports. We are beginning to introduce a Monday

focus where all students Year 1-6 line up straight after recess and lunch time for PBS focus for the week and any key messages.

Explicit PBS lessons will also be taught each Monday. The first focus is on 'Wearing School Uniform with Pride.' The other messages this term will be Displaying Good "Sportsperson ship" and Being Responsible by picking up rubbish when we see it.

Positive Behaviour Supports & Triple PPP Parenting sessions

If any parents are interested in learning more about this approach, we can hold Triple PPP Parenting sessions, which align with the Positive Behaviour Supports. Please contact the office if you would like our School Psychologist to hold one of these sessions.

Maths Strategies

We have just recently had Erin Ven De Sluys in to work alongside early childhood teachers and our coaches to look at the 3 stages of understanding numbers and oral calculations and different strategies. Teachers will be implementing these over the next couple of weeks.

Prime Mathematics

Students will be completing their first Prime Booklets. Please have a look at these on open night and ask your child about the strategies they have learnt through mathematics this year.

Home Reading

Congratulations to those students have been reading every night during the weekdays! Reading every night is very important for students' fluency. One important thing to ask your child to check their comprehension is "What was the book about?" Students need to be able to retell the events in order, including the characters and the outcome.

Connected Community

Business Plan 2023-2025

The new business plan has now been endorsed by the school board and will be sent off for printing. In Week 6 SIMS we be coming up for filming and taking some videos to showcase our school on the website and for the business plan publication. This will involve Clontarf training, Book Week assembly, explicit direct instruction lessons throughout the day, Open Night, and show casing the school areas.

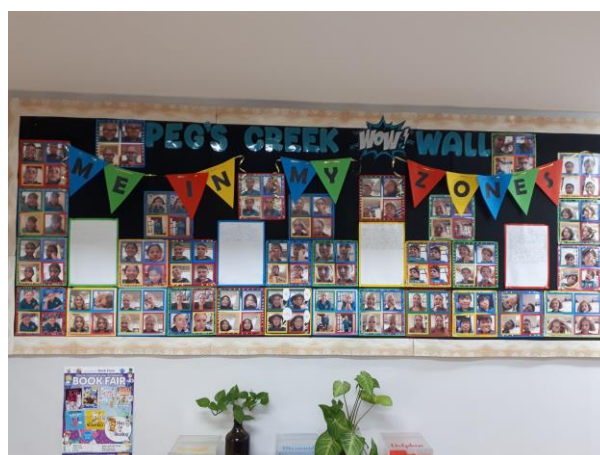
Behaviour Policy Review.

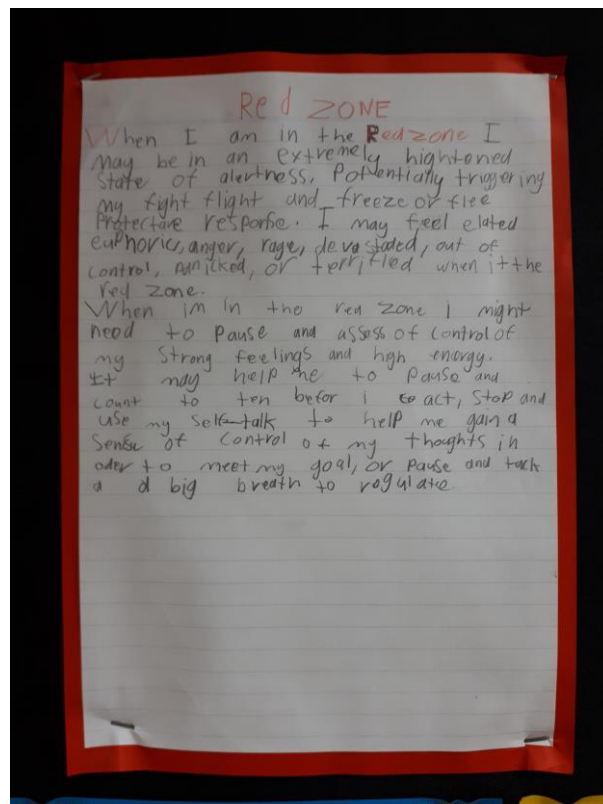
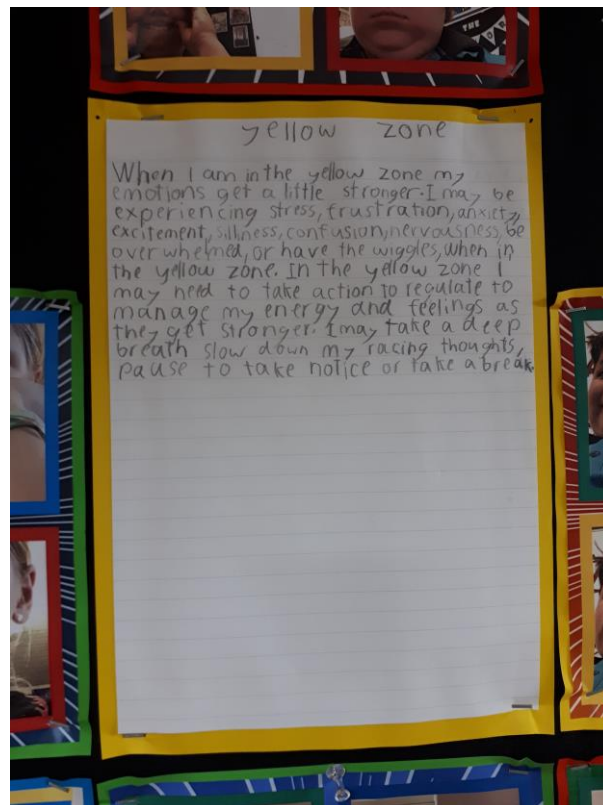
2 - TA 11 - Zones of Regulation

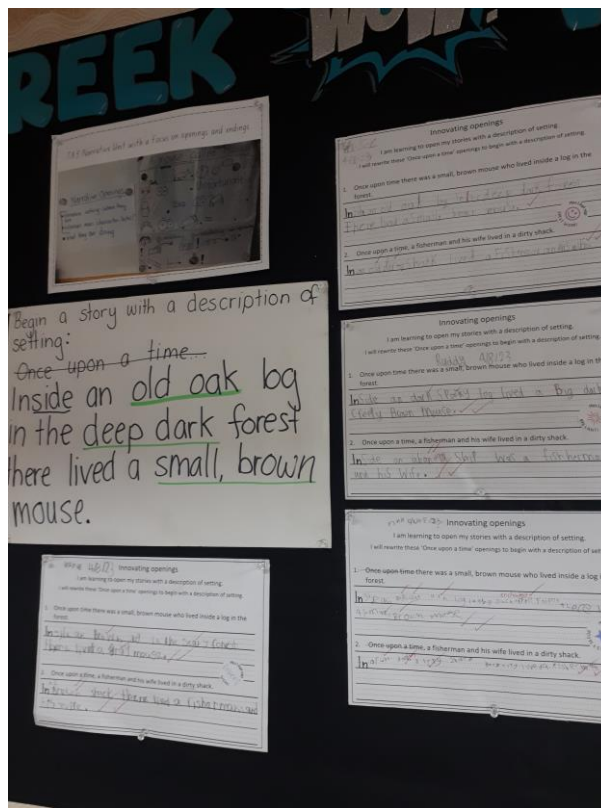
Green Zone
