Interschool Athletics

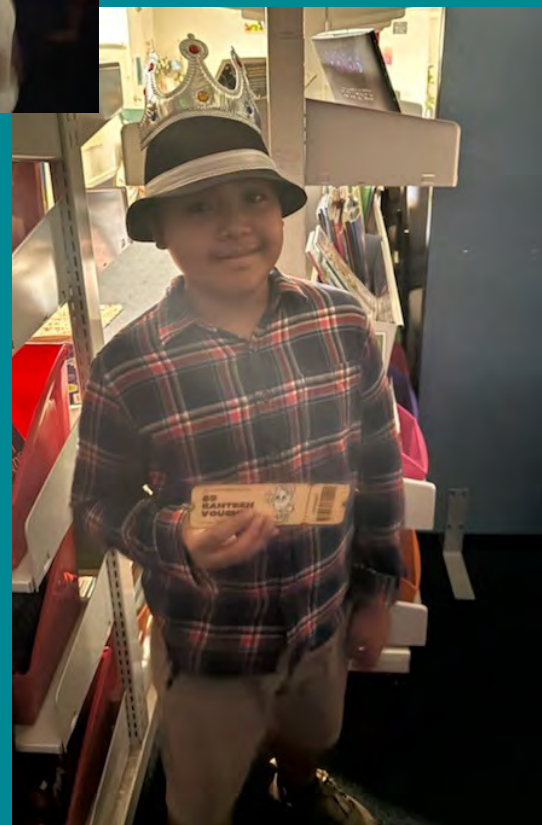

Heart Horses

Several students from Year 4—6 recently took part in the very first *Heart Horses* program, “**Energy is Our Superpower**”, right here at Peg’s Creek Primary School in partnership with Pilbara Heart Horses. The program was developed with the aim of creating a safe, trauma-informed space where students learned how their energy influences others, especially horses, who offer immediate, honest feedback. Students explored emotional regulation, self-awareness, and energetic communication with the help of horses.

Peg’s Creek Primary students participated in the four-week program with horses Vegas and Breeze, and pony Max. Max even came back to visit for our Week 1 assembly!

Flourishing Individuals

High Quality Teaching

The teachers have looked at your child's data in term 3 and the aspects of their learning that are not in their long-term memory have been noted and these are in this term's daily reviews in English and Mathematics. Please talk to your child's teacher in a parent /teacher interview about what Elastik is showing are the strengths and gaps in your child's learning.

Attendance and Engagement

Attending school is vital for students to build on information they have learnt in previous lessons. When students are away, they miss critical lessons which impacts their understanding. Everyday matters so please unless students are unwell, make sure they attend school. If their attendance is under 80% students will be on an attendance plan which parents will be informed of for the next 5 week period.

Engaging, calm and orderly classroom environments

To ensure that the start of the day is calm, we have commenced 'Morning Circles' in most rooms. This is a strategy from the Berry Street Educational Framework training that our staff have been able to across through the KREI, which is sponsored by Woodside and their partners. Teachers would be explaining these in their class meetings if they are commencing them this term.

School Culture

Thank you to the parents over the last couple of weeks who have either spoken to teachers or myself about any feedback around their child's learning. As partners in your child's learning, it is so important to get this feedback and to problem solve to arrive at solutions, so all our students feel safe, welcomed and ready to learn. This is critical because there are many sides to a story and it is important to get all sides of the story to find a solution or to hold a restorative.

School Development Day

On our School Development Day this term, our teachers started the day out at Hearson's Cove. The aim of this was to gain some understanding of how we can use '2 way Science' to teach our students how Aboriginal people utilise the science in their lives and how it relates to everyday science in the curriculum.

First national support line for Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people in crisis

13YARN [Thirteen YARN] is the first national crisis support line for mob who are feeling overwhelmed or having difficulty coping.

We offer a confidential one-on-one yarning opportunity with a Lifeline-trained Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Crisis Supporter who can provide crisis support 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. 13 YARN empowers our community with the opportunity to yarn without judgement and provide a culturally safe space to speak about their needs, worries or concerns.

If you, or someone you know, are feeling worried or no good, we encourage you to connect with 13YARN on 13 92 76 (24 hours/7 days) and talk with an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander Crisis Supporter.

This is your story; your journey and we will take the time to listen. No shame, no judgement, safe place to yarn. We're here for you.

Our vision is to achieve a nation free of suicide. We know the current statistics for suicide and self-harm for Aboriginal people are disproportionately high. To tackle this problem head-on, this service will be led by an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Advisory Board and employ professionals in suicide prevention and crisis support utilising Lifeline's extensive experience and infrastructure.

13YARN is an Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander crisis support line funded by the Australian Government with the support of Lifeline and developed in collaboration with Gayaa Dhuwi (Proud Spirit) Australia. It is run by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

We have co-designed this line using Lifeline expertise with several Aboriginal mental health professionals including NACCHO, Black Dog Institute Aboriginal Lived Experience team and the Centre for Excellence in Suicide Prevention along with input from Torres Strait Islander, remote, regional, and urban peoples with lived experience.

We work to explore options for ongoing support and community members will always be reassured they will be connected to another Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander person who will understand where they are coming from and value knowing HOW to listen, without judgement or shame.
